

ABOUT THIS GUIDE

In so many parts of the world, food is on the frontline of the climate crisis. It only takes one climate disaster—a drought, flood, or heatwave—for entire villages to spiral into debt, poverty, and hunger—unraveling regional food systems and economies.

In November at COP29, the UN Climate Conference in Azerbaijan, the long-term climate finance goal will be at the forefront of negotiations.

A new report by the Global Alliance for the Future of Food shows that while overall public climate finance has increased in the past years, funding towards sustainable food systems is not keeping pace. A transformation of food systems requires an ambitious scaling up of funding. To highlight the crucial intersection of food systems and the climate crisis, we are privileged to have seventeen frontline food leaders from around the world to highlight these perspectives at COP29.

Each of them bring powerful testimonies and a strong record of championing food sovereignty and climate justice. They represent communities faced with the hard realities of adapting to a changing climate while also forging ahead with solutions based on agroecological approaches.


